Sample Team Building Activities



All Aboard

Challenge: is for the entire group to get on the platform for a set amount of time. The challenge can be varied according to group size and platform size and may be sequenced beginning with large platform to smaller platform(s).

TP Shuffle

Challenge: for the group to get on the line, divide themselves in half. Half the group is on one end, the other at the other end. Face each other and have the two groups pass each other while staying on the line without touching unmarked ground.

Variations: group line-ups (height, shoe size, birthdates)

Trolleys

Challenge: for the group to traverse a designated area utilizing the trolleys and without any participants touching the ground.

Spider's Web

Challenge: to pass entire group through the web from one side to the other without touching or disturbing the web. A hole will close if: 1) it is touched 2) a person or object has passed completely. through the hole. Participants cannot be passed over or under the web.

Pit

Challenge: to collect nine cards that are identical while navigating competing teams also trying to collect nine identical cards.

Watch Where You Step

Challenge: as a relay team navigate across a field of "mines" while blindfolded. Players freeze upon stepping on a mine and become unfrozen only when an additional player enters the field.


Triangulate Your Space



Property Rental Rules



Welcome to Camp Fire Camp El Tesoro. We want all our visitors to have an enjoyable time when they visit El Tesoro, so we ask each person to abide by the following rules.

- No pets, alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs or firearms are allowed on the property.
- El Tesoro is a smoke free property.
- Quiet hours are from 10:30 p.m. 7 a.m. Visitors should refrain from disturbing others during these times. Please remember lodges might be shared, and quiet hours must be observed inside buildings as well.
- At least two adults must accompany all groups to El Tesoro.
- Swimming is not allowed in Fall Creek or the Brazos River.
- Wading in Fall Creek is permitted with adult supervision and at the discretion of the adult in charge of the group.
- All visitors must wear shoes at all times.
- Cabins are reserved for the exclusive use of that individual or group. Entering a cabin while another group occupies it is strictly prohibited.
- Each person or group is responsible for cleanup of the buildings in which they have stayed as well as any community areas used such as the lodges and grounds around your area. If you are using a building you are responsible to see that it is left clean and in order.
- All trash must be placed in the dumpsters on your way out of camp.
- Upon arrival, you will be given our fire-building guidelines. If needed, fire safety equipment will be
 checked out to you. No propane stoves, lanterns or heaters may be used in cabins or lodges. Propane
 stoves are allowed at the fire circles.
- Upon arrival, your host will review a check-out list which is to be completed before departure.
- Camp Fire First Texas assumes no responsibility for any damage to or theft of personal items including but not limited to computers, cameras, vehicles, sports and other equipment. All sports equipment should be used only for its intended purpose and stored in a secure manner when not in use.

Vehicles in Camp

Although having your vehicle near where you are staying is convenient, we want to preserve the outdoor experience and request that you follow these rules for vehicles on property.

- Please keep vehicles on the main roads and designated parking areas.
- Vehicles are permitted inside the property, for one hour upon arrival and/or prior to departure, for loading and unloading equipment and supplies.
- After unloading, cars must be parked in the parking lot at the front of the property.
- If you have reserved Horizon Lodge or a Discovery Cabin, one car may be parked beside the building in case of an emergency.
- Texas law states individuals may not ride in the back of a pick up, on bumpers, or on hoods or trunks.



Emergency Care/First Aid

The following guidelines apply to all groups that use El Tesoro for programs and day or overnight camping including family gatherings and community groups such as youth organizations, churches, schools, etc.

Note: All groups are responsible for providing first aid and emergency care for their participants including first aid supplies and emergency transportation.

911 and CareFlite are available for medical emergencies at El Tesoro. Lake Granbury Medical Center in Granbury is the nearest hospital. See the Emergency Procedures form in your El Tesoro user documents for additional information.

In addition:

- All groups should provide an adult with CPR certification from a nationally recognized provider to be present with the group at camp.
- All youth groups with children under age 18, who are not accompanied by their parents, should provide an adult with First Aid certification from a nationally recognized provider to be present with the group at camp.
- If someone with your group experiences an accident, injury, acute or communicable illness while at camp, please complete the Incident/Accident Report available at the camp office or from the camp host.
- All groups should have pertinent information about their participants immediately available in the form of a permission slip or other document in case of an emergency. Group leaders should gather the following information:
 - 1. Names and addresses of all participants,
 - 2. Emergency contact names and numbers,
 - 3. Details concerning persons with allergies or other health conditions requiring treatment or special consideration while at camp and
 - 4. For minors without a parent on site, signed permission to seek emergency treatment or a signed religious waiver.



Emergency Procedures

We want everyone to have a safe stay at El Tesoro; however, occasional weather and health emergencies may arise. Some items to remember in case of emergency are listed below.

- In the event of an emergency, notify the site manager, program host or staff member on duty.
 Keep calm.
- 2. Plan ahead and know the fire escape route for any building in which you might be. In the event of a fire stay clear of the road, as fire trucks will be on property.
- 3. Be alert to signs of severe weather. Do not attempt to drive over a flooded road. Move vehicles to a safe area (main parking lot) before access is cut off by floodwater.
- 4. When lightning threatens, stay indoors. Don't venture outside unless absolutely necessary. Don't use plug-in electrical equipment. Get out of pools, creeks or rivers. Avoid standing under isolated trees in open areas.
- 5. In the event of a tornado, seek shelter in a building on the ground floor. Protect your head and eyes, lie flat and make as small a target as possible. Stay away from windows. Go to a bathroom or closet at the center of the building or lie flat under heavy furniture against inside walls. Stay away from large unsupported areas in buildings. If caught in open country, lie flat in a ravine or depression, but be aware of flooding.
- 6. In case of a medical emergency, notify the designated first aider or nurse. If that person is not available, remember: **A**: **A**irway, **B**: **B**reathing, and **C**: **C**irculation (stop bleeding with direct pressure, elevation or use pressure points). Notify Camp Fire staff on duty.
- 7. If a minor needs to be taken to the hospital, make every attempt to notify the guardian before transporting, as long as time permits. A responsible adult must go with the youth to the hospital. Be sure an accident/incident form is completed describing the occurrence.
- 8. If a participant is lost, contact the site manager, program host or staff member on duty. They will coordinate development of search teams.
